PROJECT LOCATION

- I-95 near the Garrisonville Road interchange in Stafford County (Mile Marker 143)
- Project is a partnership between VDOT's Fredericksburg and Northern Virginia Districts, and 95
 Express Lanes partner, Transurban






PROJECT BACKGROUND

95 Express Lanes opened in Dec. 2014, and provided new travel options during peak hours

- Northbound left slip ramp enters Express Lanes (north of Route 610)
- Southbound flyover ramp exits Express Lanes (north of Route 610)

VDOT and 95 Express Lanes, LLC looking to address congestion challenges at current entry and exit points


- Northbound delays in the a.m. peak hours approaching existing slip ramp
- Southbound delays in both the general and express lanes in the p.m. peak, approaching Garrisonville Road





PROJECT OVERVIEW

- Construct 2.2-mile reversible lane to extend Express Lanes toward the south
- Create new northbound and southbound ramps between the Express Lanes and general lanes
- Install traffic devices (dynamic message signs, cameras, gates) for express lanes reversible operation





NEW EXPRESS LANES ENTRANCE AND EXIT RAMPS

Northbound Traffic

- Traffic will be able to enter express lanes sooner (south of Garrisonville Road) with new ramp
- Existing left-side entrance ramp north of Garrisonville will remain as an alternative


Southbound Traffic

- Express lanes traffic heading toward Fredericksburg and points south will be able to continue on 2.2 mile extension past Garrisonville Road
- Existing flyover ramp will remain for motorists heading toward westbound or eastbound Garrisonville Road


EXISTING <u>NORTHBOUND</u> EXPRESS LANES DEMAND (AM PEAK HR)



- Heavy weaving volumes north of Garrisonville Road resulting in queues
- 641 vehicles from the south, plus 274 vehicles from Garrisonville ramps, access the Express Lanes during typical a.m. peak hour
- New on-ramp south of Garrisonville will take 641 vehicles out of the mix, resulting in significantly improved travel times on the general lanes

VDOT

EXISTING <u>SOUTHBOUND</u> EXPRESS LANES DEMAND (PM PEAK HR)



- Heavy weaving volumes north of Garrisonville Road resulting in queues
- 1,014 vehicles in the express lanes continue south during typical p.m. peak hour
- New 2.2-mile extension will take 1,014 vehicles out of the mix, resulting in significantly improved travel times on the express lanes for vehicles continuing south or going toward Garrisonville Road westbound



OTHER FEATURES

- All construction anticipated to occur within VDOT right of way - majority of construction in median
- No new tolling gantries proposed
 - A separate toll will not be charged to use the 2.2-mile extension - overall express lanes pricing will continue to be determined by existing dynamic pricing methodology
- New sound wall proposed along outer edge of southbound general lanes, within VDOT property
- Design elements such as overhead signs and traffic devices will be set outside the limits of future project improvements



PROJECT BENEFITS

- Reduced delays for northbound general traffic in the a.m. peak hours
- Reduced delays for southbound express lanes traffic in the p.m. peak hours
- Safety improvements due to the reduced number of vehicles weaving to enter or exit the express lanes
- Overall increase in capacity, while staying within existing VDOT right of way

ESTIMATED PROJECT COSTS

- Total Cost: Approx. \$50 million
- Contribution from 95 Express Lanes private partner: \$25 million



FUTURE I-95 PROJECTS

I-95/Rte 630 (Courthouse Rd) Interchange

- Located at Exit 140 in Stafford County
- Diverging Diamond Interchange
 - Reduce conflict points
 - Enhance safety and operations
- Design-Build project procurement underway
- Construction anticipated 2017 to 2020
- Bid Option to include I-95 Southbound 4th Lane in median (continuation of Southern Terminus Southbound ramp past Courthouse Rd)



FUTURE I-95 PROJECTS

I-95 Rappahannock River Crossing, Southbound

- Addition of 2 parallel lanes to I-95 Southbound between Route 17 and Route 3 interchanges
- Scored according to House Bill 2 prioritization process
- Recommended for funding
- CTB action scheduled for June 2016
- Region can re-submit future Northbound I-95
 Rappahannock River Crossing project for HB-2
 scoring
